Buy a Brick!

Purchase a brick today and you will help to ensure a legacy of Humboldt County's history will be forever accessible to the public. The Ryan House and Garden is the site of the ancestral home of the Pierce H. and Annie B. Ryan Family. Pierce was the younger brother of James Talbot Ryan who first named Eureka. Your contribution will help to restore and preserve both the Annie B Ryan house on F Street and these gardens where the Pierce Ryan home stood. The rose garden and this patio of commemorative bricks outline where the house once stood. Your engraved brick will go in this patio.

A brick purchased can honor a loved one, a group, a class, your business, or be a memorial to a loved one. Bricks can be purchased in two sizes - 4" x 8" for \$100 with up to three lines of engraving, or 8" x 8" for \$150 with up to six lines of engraving. Each line can be 20 characters long including spacing and punctuation. Engraving is in capital letters with the exception of last names such as McCALL, MacTAVISH, or Le GRANDE.

To purchase your brick fill out the form below. For multiple bricks of the same size fill out a separate form for each brick with your name and put the total amount and payment information on just one page.
